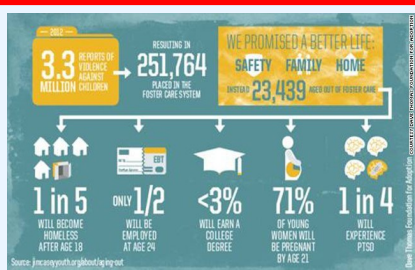
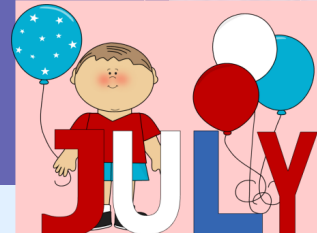

We are abandoning children in foster care

(CNN) -- In 2012 in the United States, 23,439 children in foster care turned 18 and were "emancipated" or "aged out." In simple terms, most of them were put out into the world on their own without housing, financial assistance or emotional support.

Take Adrian, now 27. After being placed into foster care at 6 because of his mother's drug and alcohol abuse, he stayed in care, moving from home to home, until he was 18 and too old for the system. He found the strength to try to put himself through college, using the county van his caseworker helped secure to move there.

When I despaired, people's kindness helped me find my way back to my children.

My kids were taken into custody in 2007. I was using meth and selling also.

I never, ever wanted to hurt my kids. I thought I loved them with all my heart.

At the time, Jayme was 2 and Sheryl was 3. My kids loved to be with me. I rode a bike with a trailer attached to the back that the kids loved to ride in. They would cry when I went somewhere by myself.

But I was also using every day.

Become a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)

Cherish was five when she was matched with her CASA advocate Mona. She had been brutally abused, and had no healthy parental figure, which resulted in her use of foul language, tantrums (including while she was with her advocate), and physical aggression. She was expelled from kindergarten for knocking over the principal who had leaned down to talk to her.

Her advocate, who knew that she was very bright, visited multiple schools in an attempt to find the perfect teacher to deal with Cherish – someone who could see past the behaviors to her amazing potential. Mona also helped find a single woman who was willing to adopt Cherish even with all the challenges she presented. The advocate continued to work with Cherish and support her to ensure the adoption was successful. Cherish could have been relegated to moving from school to school, foster home to foster home, from therapist to therapist, but Mona would not permit that to happen to this girl with amazing potential, despite her out-of-control behavior.

Cherish is now a happy 17-year-old and remains in her adoptive home, due to the faith and efforts of her CASA advocate.
